




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Read before using this guidebook

#### **Warning**

This guidebook is a compilation of unverified information gathered from many different climbers.

The author cannot ensure the accuracy of any of the information in this book, including topos and route descriptions, difficulty ratings, and protection ratings.

These may be incorrect or misleading, as ratings of climbing difficulty and risk are always subjective and depend on the physical characteristics (for example, height), experience, technical ability, confidence, and physical fitness of the climber who supplied the rating.

Additionally, climbers who achieve first ascents sometimes underrate the difficulty or risk of the climbing route.

Therefore, be warned that you must exercise your own judgment on where a climbing route goes, its difficulty, and your ability to safely protect yourself from the risks of rock climbing.

Examples of some of these risks are: falling due to technical difficulty or due to natural hazards such as holds breaking, falling rock, climbing equipment dropped by other climbers, adverse weather conditions, failure of your own equipment, and failure or absence of fixed protection.

## Here are some ways to use this guidebook more safely.

- 1. Consultation: You should always consult with other climbers about the difficulty and risks of a particular route before attempting it. Most local climbers are glad to provide advice on routes in their area; we suggest that you contact locals to confirm grades and safety of particular routes and to obtain first-hand information about the route of your choice.
- 2. Instruction: Most climbing areas have local climbing instructors and guides available. If you're new unfamiliar with climbing or unfamiliar with the area, we recommend that you hire an instructor or guide to learn safety techniques and to become familiar with the routes and hazards of the areas described in this book. Even if you are already proficient in climbing safety, occasionally hiring a guide is a sure way to raise your climbing standard and learn advanced techniques.
- **3. Fixed Protection:** Some of the routes in this book may use fixed bolts and pitons that have

been pre-placed on the rock. Because of variances in the manner of placement, weathering, metal fatigue, the quality of the metal used, and many other factors, these fixed protection pieces should always be sceptically considered.

Never depend on a single piece of fixed protection for your safety, because you can never tell whether it will single-handedly hold your weight. In some cases, fixed protection may have been removed or is now missing.

However, climbers should avoid adding new pieces of fixed protection, unless they deem the pre-placed protection faulty and are looking to replace it. Existing protection can be tested by an experienced climber, to determine its strength. The ethics of climbing also strongly discourage adding bolts or drilled pitons to a pre-existing route, intending the route to be climbed as it was meant to by the first ascent party.

# Be aware of the following potential inaccuracies while using this guidebook:

#### 1. Incorrect Descriptions of Routes:

If you're not sure where exactly your route is going, exercise your own judgment as to whether you should continue or retreat.

Route descriptions and topos in this book could be inaccurate or misleading.

#### 2. Incorrect Difficulty Rating:

A route might be harder than the rating indicates. Do not be lulled into a false sense of security by the grade.

#### 3. Incorrect Protection Rating:

If you're climbing a route and you are unable to arrange adequate protection through the use of fixed pitons or bolts and by placing your own protection devices, do not assume that there is adequate protection available higher just because the route protection rating indicates so. Every route is potentially an X (a fall may be deadly), due to the inherent hazards of climbing—including, for example, failure or absence of fixed protection,

your gear, faulty protection placement, or improper use of climbing equipment.

#### 4. Failure to Warn of a Particular Hazard:

Although an effort has been made to warn of known hazards on particular routes, this guide is by no means comprehensive, when it comes to potential risks and hazards involved in climbing. Climb carefully, at your own risk, and always be watchful.

There are no warranties, whether expressed or implied, that this guidebook is accurate or that the information in it is reliable.

There are no warranties of fitness for a particular purpose or that this guide is merchantable. Your use of this book indicates your assumption of the risk that it may contain errors and is an acknowledgment of your own sole responsibility for your climbing safety.

Once upon a time in the 2000s, a climbing revolution took place in **Ermionida**, East Peloponnese. The British climber **Jim Titt** and the German climber **Inge Zaczek** equipped more than **200 routes** on the area's excellent limestone rocks using stainless steel bolts. They dedicated significant time, money, and effort to the development of sport climbing in the region, for which we are grateful. Since **2021**, the local climbing community **Climb Ermionida** has carried out maintenance work on various crags, replaced several anchors, developed three new crags, established many new routes, and even introduced new adventure multipitch routes, always using **UIAA-certified** gear.



#### **About Ermionida**

**Ermionida** is a municipality in the Argolis regional unit, Peloponnese, Greece. The seat of the municipality is the town of Kranidi.

**Ermioni** is a small fishing town in Ermionida (Argolis) on the east of Peloponnese. The traditional taverns, the cafés, the paved streets, the beautiful houses and the crystal clear beaches around this area are some of the reasons which make this town is an interesting summer destination of Peloponnese.

While travelling around the area, you will have the chance to admire olive and pine trees along with plenty of bays with turquoise waters but also plenty of climbing crags.

Rock climbing around Ermionida and generally the region of Argolis is all on excellent **solid grey limestone**.

The majority of the routes are single pitch sport climbing routes, however there are some trad climbing routes as well.

However, all of the climbing areas are only partially developed, which means there is a massive opportunity to establish new routes in the area.

The area of Argolis gets over 3,000 hours of sunshine per year and is a popular holiday destination.

This also means that it is possible to rock climb virtually throughout the whole year in the region, even in the hot summer months, as some crags such as **Didyma** are found on higher elevation - as high as 1,000 m.!

#### **History**

Ermioni (Ancient Hermione) was originally founded by the mythical hero Ermionas and the ancient **Dryopian tribe**, and dedicated to the 'messenger' god, Hermes, and later, during the Mycenaean period, to Hermione, daughter of Helen and Menelaus, King of Sparta.

The area of Ermionis has been inhabited **since the Paleolithic period**, 40,000 years ago. Archaeological excavations at the Mesolithic Fragthi Cave unveiled the oldest complete human skeleton in Europe, dating back to 23,000 BC.

From **14th to 8th Century BC**, many settlements were established in the Southern Argolida region, as elsewhere in Greece. By 6th Century BC some of these villages had grown into real towns and large cities, such as **Hermione** (Ermioni), **Halieis** (Porto Heli), **Mases** (Kilada) and **Eileoi** (Iliokastro).

This laid the foundations for the archaic Hermionis Kingdom, ruled from the walled city of Hermione, located on the ancient Bisti peninsula. Hermione witnessed considerable prosperity during the Hellenistic and Republican Roman periods, particularly after the Romans had taken control of the city, following the destruction of ancient Corinth in 146 BC.

When **Pausanias** visited Hermione, he described with admiration the lavish temples, sancturies, stadium, festivals, music contests and swimming races that brought so much glory to the ancient Kingdom of Hermionis and the surrounding area.





## KATAFYKI GORGE

#### **General** information

An impressive gorge with a main face **over 150 m.** high and an impressive rock expanse along the river bed. Further up on the northern side there is a large area of rock- still undeveloped.

The main wall has an impressive overhanging middle section traversed mid-height by a large horizontal roof with holes. At first sight this can be somewhat overwhelming but once you're on, it turns out to be more amenable than one would have expected.

A very short approach (crag is just 20 meters off the road) and good protection from the elements make this area worth a visit.

Climbing in Katafyki is pleasant throughout the year, as the main wall is shaded after mid-day. There are **72 routes** here, among which, there are 4 multi-pitch trad routes reaching up to 123m. and 3 multi-pitch sport routes up to 150 m. in length.







so it's easy to miss!). Take a hard left and follow the tight tarmac road for about 3 km. until you come to an agricultural dirt road with a sign pointing to Katafyki to the west.

Another 500 m. of well trodden dirt road among olive groves and you are at the crag.





#### **General** information

A new sport climbing crag was developed near Ermioni and specifically near the already well established climbing crag Katafyki.

The crag was developed and equipped in early spring 2022 by Vertical Art Greece with main equipper K. Grafanakis and with a kind contribution of the local climbing community, Climb Ermionida.

The rock consists of grey-brown and red lime-

stone of very good quality but due to the fact the crag is newly developed, the rock on some routes might be a bit sharp. In total there are 8 routes for all types of climbing, but was mainly developed for climbers taking their first steps on the vertical walls.

Best seasons to visit the Petrogerakas Crag is from late Autumn till late Spring.







Follow the signs to **Ermioni** and drive along the long straight section until you reach an inconspicuous stone chapel on your left and a small sign towards **Katafyki Gorge** (oriented towards the opposite direction so it's easy to miss!). Take a hard left and follow

the tight tarmac road for about 3 km. until you come to dirt road with a sign pointing to Katafyki to the west. From Katafyki parking spot, follow the trail that leads to Petrogerakas crag.

Once on the trail, follow the red signs.

Attention: the trail is very steep, though the approach hike is not very difficult.

**Petrogerakas crag** is located on the top of the wall northern of the main crag of **Katafyki**.



#### **General information**

A new Multi-Pitch climbing crag was developed near **Ermioni** and specifically near the already well established climbing crag **Katafyki**.

The crag was developed and **equipped in 2022** by **Vertical Art Greece** with main equipper **K. Grafanakis** and with a kind contribution of the local climbing community, **Climb Ermionida**.

Pleiades crag, is located on the west wall in the ravine of Katafyki, and specifically, between the Katafyki Main Crag and the Petrogerakas Crag.

As of **Autumn 2025**, there are four fully bolted Multi-Pitch routes, **MAIA** (5c, 178 m.), **TAYGETE** (6b+, 205 m.), **ALCYONE** (6a, 100 m.) **ASTEROPE** (6b+, 130m.) and **ELECTRA** (VI UIAA, 145 m.).

All routes end at the top of the cliff with some stunning views toward **Ermioni** and the gulf of **Hydra** island.





Approaching **Kranidi** from the north, you will come across an intersection. Follow the signs to Ermioni and drive along the long straight section until you reach an inconspicuous stone chapel on your left and a small sign towards **Katafyki Gorge** (oriented towards the opposite direction

so it's easy to miss!). Take a hard left and follow the tight tarmac road for about 3 km. Park the car at the **St. Nicholas chapel** and follow the trail that goes under the bridge. From that point, you will have a clear view of the ridge and you have to follow the cairn (pile of stones).

#### Route description

#### Pitch 1 (5c - 35 m.)

The first pitch, and specifically the first 10 meters of the route, are perhaps the most demanding of the entire 178 m. of the climb.

The route starts with a slight negative slab, but there are good holds and plenty of options for the feet. In addition, this first part, and generally the entire route is well equipped and very friendly to all type of climbers.

After the 4th bolt, you have to do a small **traverse towards the left**, so make sure to place an **alpine quickdraw** there (4th bolt), so you will minimise the rope drag while you will be climbing higher up.

Upon the traverse, the climb becomes easier (about 5b) and as soon you reach the ledge, you will easily spot the anchors.

**ATTENTION:** On the first ascent, about 2 meters left from the belay station, we spotted a hole with a Viber Berus snake in it. So, should you want to climb in the summer time, and on R1, pay a bit extra attention.

#### Pitch 2 (5b - 25 m.)

The second pitch starts right above the **R1** and moves with a small traverse to the left until you come on the slab. Like on Pitch 1, also for **Pitch 2 the crux (5b) is at the beginning**, thus you have to pay a bit attention while traversing.

As soon we reach the slab, the climb again is easier (around 5a) and we have to follow the ridge till the obvious ledge where another anchor point is placed.

The belay station is very comfortable and from that point and on you start to enjoy the stunning views bellow at the ravine of Katafyki.

#### Pitch 3 (5b - 30 m.)

The third pitch is continues in the same style as the last part of Pitch 2, which basically consists of following the ridge by climbing from a boulder to boulder with some small ledges till we find a slab with a bit negative start.

Before you enter the slab, there is a bolt that will make you feel safe and although it might seem a bit difficult to climb on top of the slab, there are enough holds for the hands. Upon that, we end up in another ledge, where **R3** is located.

The view from R3 is really wonderful with a clear view of both Katafyki crag and Petrogerakas crag.

The maximum difficulty of this pitch is around 5b.

#### Pitch 4 (5b+ - 48 m.)


The fourth pitch is again a very nice pitch where the difficulty is again at the beginning. In the first few meters, we have to climb in a dihedral and at some point we have to do a small traverse (2-3 steps) to the left in order to enter and continue our climb on the slab. Upon that, we continue to climb right on the ridge and this makes the climb to feel very special.

This is the lengthiest pitch and like the previous pitches is well equipped. Due to the fact this pitch is about **48 meters long**, make sure to **add some alpine quickdraws** in order to minimise the rope drag.

#### Pitch 5 (5a - 40 m.)

The fifth and final pitch of this great route, although is the easiest pitch, is perhaps the nicest too with a lovely "surprise" at the end. I won't describe much of this pitch, in order to not spoil the nice finishing of the Ridge

Though, what I can certainly attest, is that the **view from R5 is simply majestic**. Stunning views towards **Ermioni, Hydra, Dokos, Dardiza, Spetses** and of course a great "bird's eye" view towards the **Katafyki Climbing Crag**.



## **TAYGETE**

6b+ | 205 m. ★★★☆

Katafyki - Ermioni

1st Ascent: 30/10/2022

1st Ascensionists: C. Rigas & Olympus Mountaineering

#### Route description

#### Pitch 1 (5c - 40 m.)

The first pitch, starts slightly to the left from the main ridge of **Pleiades** crag and the start is easy.

The route starts with a positive slab, and right after we enter to the zone of some overhangs, where there are good holds and plenty of options for the feet. On the **5th bolt**, where the **crux of the first pitch is located**, you have to climb an overhang and upon that, the climb becomes easier (about 5b) and as soon you reach the ledge, you will easily spot the anchors.

#### Pitch 2 (5c+ - 25 m.)

The second pitch starts right above the **R1** and moves with a small traverse to the right with small hold but enough options for the correct foot placement. The **crux (5c+) of Pitch 2** is **located on the 4th bolt** and you have to make sure you clip in before you climb that part.

As soon you climb the crux, there is a positive slab with tiny holds, but the climb on that part is a bit easier (around 5b).

The belay station is very comfortable and from that point and on you start to enjoy the stunning views bellow at the ravine of **Katafyki** but also the rest of **Taygete** route.

#### Pitch 3 (5a - 30 m.)

The third pitch starts with a slight **exposure** and a great view to the south but also the north side of **Katafyki Ravine**. Although this pitch is not difficult (5a), there are a bit less bolts placed, thus one should climb this pitch carefully.

As soon you climb the ridge, you have to move towards the left, where you will locate R3 and the traverse pitch starts.

The view from R3 is really wonderful with a clear view of both Katafyki crag and Petrogerakas crag.

#### Pitch 4 Traverse (5a - 40 m.)

The fourth pitch is perhaps the less pleasant of all pitches, due to the fact most of this **40 meters pitch** is a traverse on a ledge that moves across the crag. This pitch is not difficult and there is a small part of scrambling of a maximum difficult around 4c/5a but most of the pitch is simple hike.

#### Pitch 5 (6a+ - 40 m.)


The fifth pitch starts right above the R4 and is the **nicest pitch of Taygete route**, and perhaps one of the nicest and most complete pitches I have every climbed. This is a 40 meters length continuous **6a+** pitch where you will come across different kind of climbing styles, from slab to crack and also a small overhang. The **crux of this pitch is located about 8 meters above the R4** and you need to climb along a crack where besides the bolts, you can certainly place other protection gear if you want.

Arriving at R5, you have splendid view towards the last pitch. Belay location is less comfortable compared to the other ones

#### Pitch 6 (6b+ - 40 m.)

The sixth and final pitch, technically is the most demanding pitch, with a maximum difficulty of **6b/+**. Though, the **crux** of this pitch and of the entire route consists of some moves that require good coordination and balance. Besides the crux, the rest of the pitch is much easier of a maximum difficulty of around **5c**.

As soon we reach the R6, we come across stunning views towards **Ermioni, Hydra, Dokos, Dardiza, Spetses** and of course a great "bird's eye" view towards the **Katafyki Climbing Crag**.



## **ALCYONE**

6a | 100 m. ★★★★

Katafyki - Ermioni

1st Ascent: 29/05/2023

1st Ascensionists: K. Grafanakis & Olympus Mountaineering

#### Route description

#### Pitch 1 (6a - 30 m.)

The initial pitch of **Alcyone**, situated a few meters to the right (south) of the main ridge of the **Pleiades crag**, proves to be the most challenging segment of the route.

The ascent commences with a positive slab, followed by the need to surmount overhangs. These overhangs offer moderate holds, requiring careful foot and body placement. The first pitch of **Alcyone extends approximately 30 meters**, presenting a continuous climb featuring a mix of slab and overhang sections.

Climbers are encouraged to follow the natural line of the rock, seeking the most intuitive path. Upon reaching the prominent ledge, the next step involves a traverse towards the left, where the anchors and R1 come into view.

The belay station situated on this ledge offers both comfort and a delightful vantage point, overlooking the Katafyki and Petrogerakas crags.

This pitch, in parts might contain some loose rocks, so be delicate while climbing.

#### Pitch 2 (5c - 25 m.)

Commencing just above **R1**, the second pitch demands a dynamic move to position your body correctly and securely clip in the **second bolt**. Once you conquer the initial section, a ledge greets you. From this ledge, a slight movement to the right leads to the **crux of the pitch**, rated at 5c. Be aware that this particular passage may induce a sense of discomfort due to the slight exposure and average rock quality. However, once you successfully navigate this challenging section, the remainder of the pitch becomes considerably easier. After reaching the ledge, a straightforward walk of approximately **8 meters** brings you to the belay station.

Rest assured, the belay station provides exceptional comfort, and from this vantage point, you gain clear visibility of the upcoming sections: **pitch 3 and pitch 4**.

#### Pitch 3 (5b - 20 m.)

To embark on the **third pitch**, you begin slightly to the right from the anchors, aiming for the prominent **dihedral**. While this section does not pose significant difficulty, ample holds and foothold placements are available. It is important to approach this segment with the mindset of climbing a dihedral, utilizing the natural features to your advantage.

After securing the **fifth bolt**, veer towards the right to ascend to the ridge's pinnacle. Although a slight sense of exposure may be felt, the subsequent moves unfold gracefully on remarkably solid rock.

While this pitch is the shortest among the four, it rewards climbers with delightful movements that perfectly align with its grade (5b).

Resting at **R3** provides a truly splendid view, encompassing a wonderful panorama. Moreover, this belay station offers both serenity and comfort, allowing climbers to savor the surroundings while regrouping for the continuation of the ascent.


#### Pitch 4 (5c - 25 m.)

As we embark on the **fourth and final pitch of Alcyone**, we once again encounter a captivating start on a rock of remarkable quality. The challenge on this pitch emerges right from the outset, persisting until the fifth bolt.

Within the initial **10 meters**, climbers must maintain a continuous and sustained ascent, facing a difficulty level of **around 5c**, **perhaps even approaching 6a**. Once the **crux of this pitch** is overcome, the climb gradually becomes easier, with a maximum difficulty of approximately 5a.

It is noteworthy that the last anchor is not equipped with bolts but instead relies on a large tree. Therefore, it is crucial to carry slings with you, ensuring the establishment of a secure anchor point.

Upon reaching R4, our journey to conquer Alcyone, one of the seven sisters, draws to a close.



## **ELECTRA**

VI | 145 m. ★★☆☆

Katafyki - Ermioni

1st Ascent: 20/04/2025

1st Ascensionists: K. Grafanakis & D. Economou

#### Route description

#### Pitch 1 (IV UIAA - 35 m. | 2 Bolts)

The first pitch of **Electra** starts just left of the Maia route's ridge, offering an inviting and steady introduction on solid lime-stone. It begins with a gentle, slabby ramp graded **IV-UIAA**, providing around **10 meters of relaxed climbing** with excellent holds. As the terrain steepens slightly, a compact boulder marks the location of the first bolt and introduces a short crux section (IV UIAA). This bulge is **well-protected** by the bolt but also allows for additional gear placements, making it suitable for those honing their trad skills with a standard rack of cams and nuts.

After the **crux of this pitch**, the route transitions into easier ground, continuing up featured limestone with good friction and secure movement. A second bolt midway through adds psychological comfort as the pitch progresses through stepped ledges and small vertical pulls. The pitch finishes on a wide, comfortable belay ledge equipped with two stainless steel anchors. With sweeping views over the **Katafyki Ravine**, it's a perfect spot to rest, rehydrate, and prepare for the next stage.

#### Pitch 2 (IV UIAA - 30 m. | 2 Bolts)

The second pitch of **Electra** continues the moderate, enjoyable character of the climb, featuring well-textured limestone and engaging movement. Starting from a spacious belay ledge, the pitch begins with an easy, **inclined slab IV UIAA** offering around **7 meters** of secure and flowing climbing. As the wall steepens slightly, a short crux section appears at a small vertical step near the first bolt, requiring focused movement but remaining consistent with the pitch's overall grade. Climbers can find gear placements in nearby cracks and pockets, making this a good stretch to practice traditional gear placements.

Beyond the **crux of the second pitch**, the route eases into broken ledges and shallow grooves, maintaining solid friction and offering comfortable holds throughout. A **second bolt midway** provides added confidence as the line trends gently left toward the anchor. The pitch ends on a spacious ledge equipped with two stainless steel anchors, ideal for setting up a **secure belay** and preparing for the next stage.

#### Pitch 3 (V+ UIAA - 30 m. | 5 Bolts)


**Pitch 3** of **Electra** introduces the most sustained and technical climbing so far, beginning directly from the **belay at R2** with an elegant **slab graded V– UIAA**. This initial **8-meter section requires precise footwork and balance** on increasingly subtle holds as the angle steepens. The climb then moves into steeper terrain with a steady sequence of moves around **V UIAA**, maintaining the pitch's demanding nature.

Midway through, a brief rest section allows for easier climbing before reaching the technical slab that defines the pitch. Graded at **V+ UIAA**, this **crux demands friction-based movement** and focused execution, with a shallow **dihedral** off to the right but the true line staying on the face. Protection is excellent, with multiple fixed bolts and a cordelette securing the hardest moves. After the slab, the difficulty eases to **IV UIAA**, leading to a more featured surface and ending at a secure, comfortable belay stance at **R3 with two fixed anchors**.

#### Pitch 4 (VI UIAA – 45 m. | 5 Bolts)

The final pitch of Electra is the longest and most demanding, blending moderate climbing with a distinct crux and sections of loose rock that require careful attention. It starts from the R3 belay with easy, featured limestone (III UIAA), allowing quick progress and momentum. As the pitch unfolds, the difficulty gradually increases to IV+ UIAA until reaching a small wild olive tree about 15 meters in—this marks the entrance to the crux.

Just above the tree, the route enters a **vertical dihedral graded VI UIAA**, the hardest section of the entire climb. Protected by two bolts, this **crux** demands precise movement and focus, especially as some flakes on the right side appear unstable. After the dihedral, the route turns right, following a less technical but fragile boulder section, then veers left near the third bolt. Two more **bolts** guide the final moves toward the top, **ending at R4**—a solid anchor just below the summit ledge of **Pleiades Crag**.



## **ASTEROPE**

6b+ | 130 m. ★★☆☆☆

Katafyki - Ermioni

1st Ascent: 31/03/2024

1st Ascensionists: K. Grafanakis, D. Economou and E. Tsape

#### **Route description**

#### Pitch 1 (5b, 25 m. | 10 Bolts)

The first pitch of Asterope starts further left (west) of the prominent ridge where Maia is located. The terrain here eases you in, with friendly features and solid, well-structured limestone. Follow the bolts trending left, climbing over a few well-protected bulges in the opening meters. Above, the line moves onto a pleasant slab with excellent footholds and positive hand placements, offering relaxed, fluid movement—an ideal warm-up for the pitches ahead. Around the sixth bolt, expect the crux section (5b) of this pitch. The pitch finishes on a spacious belay ledge, equipped with two stainless-steel anchors for a secure and efficient stance. The belay is comfortable and exposed, with sweeping views over the Katafyki Ravine and the surrounding limestone walls—a perfect spot to rest, hydrate, and take in the scenery before committing to the next pitch.

#### Pitch 2 (5c, 30 m. | 14 Bolts)

The second pitch of Asterope begins directly above the first belay and immediately picks up in intensity. The line follows a distinct zigzag sequence, offering more dynamic and sustained moves compared to the opening pitch. The climbing here is engaging and slightly more physical, demanding precise footwork and confident clipping through well-placed bolts. As the terrain eases, the route transitions onto a beautiful slab section characterized by excellent handholds and solid friction. The climbing becomes more fluid and rhythmic, allowing you to enjoy the exposure while keeping a steady pace upward. Despite its mellow appearance, this section still rewards careful balance and attention to foot placement. After approximately 30 meters and 14 bolts, the pitch ends at a comfortable anchor on the left, marked by two stainless steel bolts. The belay offers a secure stance and a moment to relax before tackling the higher pitches an ideal spot to regroup, hydrate, and appreciate the evolving character of the climb.

#### Pitch 3 (6b, 20 m. | 12 Bolts)


he third pitch of Asterope starts with an easy and enjoyable section, around 5b in difficulty, following clean rock and positive holds. The movement here feels smooth and intuitive, allowing climbers to find their rhythm while enjoying the flow of the line. It's a pleasant start that builds confidence before the terrain begins to steepen and demand more precision. As you progress upward, the character of the pitch changes. The rock becomes more compact, and the moves turn technical and delicate, requiring balance, accurate footwork, and thoughtful sequencing. The climbing here is sustained but rewarding, blending subtle slab technique with small edges and shallow footholds. The final meters deliver the crux (of this pitch) sequence (6b), where the last three bolts are notably challenging and reachy. Good clipping positions are limited, so composure and efficient movement are key. After roughly 20 meters and 12 bolts, the pitch finishes at the next belay station (R3).

#### Pitch 4 (6b+, 35 m. | 17 Bolts)

The fourth pitch of Asterope stands out as the most impressive and demanding section of the entire route. It begins with a short, easier stretch of around 5c, offering a few relaxed moves before the pitch commits into the heart of the steep dihedral. The transition is striking and the wall turns slightly overhanging, and the exposure increases dramatically. Once inside the dihedral, the climbing becomes powerful and sustained, requiring precise body positioning and efficient use of opposition techniques. The rock quality remains excellent, and the section is well-bolted, with bolts placed exactly where it's needed. Still, this section tests both endurance and focus, as the holds thin out and sequences demand careful planning. The crux of the entire Asterope route unfolds here, a 10–12 meter stretch of steep, technical climbing that will push you to your maximum strength. It's a sequence that rewards persistence and composure, leading eventually to a satisfying exit onto easier terrain. The pitch finishes at a solid belay station (R4), offering a well-earned rest and stunning views of the gorge below.

#### Pitch 5 (5c, 20 m. | 10 Bolts)

The fifth and final pitch of Asterope offers a beautiful and varied finish to the route. From the R4 belay, the route continues over spiky, featured limestone, blending small cracks and shallow dihedrals that make for enjoyable, three-dimensional movement. The climbing remains within the 5c range, providing steady and fluid progress after the intensity of the previous pitch. The rock here offers numerous options for hands and feet, allowing climbers to move naturally while enjoying the exposure of the upper wall. Though the pitch is well-bolted, it rewards efficient rope management and mindful clipping, especially in sections where the line wanders slightly between features. It's recommended to carry three 60 cm slings with carabiners to extend draws on the 3rd, 5th, and 9th bolts, reducing rope drag and maintaining smooth movement. After roughly 20 meters and 10 bolts, the route reaches the final belay station (R5). A satisfying conclusion to Asterope, with panoramic views across the Katafyki Gorge and the sense of accomplishment that comes from completing one of its most elegant multi-pitch climbs.



## **DARDIZA**

#### General information

This is a tiny crag bolted by **Hans** and **Jeannette** Weninger and could also be considered a good location for bouldering.

On the south face of the rock, there are two routes (George and Filia). The rest of the rock remains unexploited for the time being.

While the south-east face of this tiny crag offers solid rock quality, its south-west face has some loose rocks.

Dardiza crag is recommended mainly for longterm visitors in the area who have already explored the other crags.

The access is short and easy and the views from the crag are simply stunning.

#### General information

The Castle of Thermisia appears in the written sources, as Trémis, for the first time in 1347, in the will of Gautier II de Brienne, Count of Lecce, de jure Duke of Athens, and de facto Lord of Argos and Nauplia. Surprisingly the castle is not referenced in an otherwise comprehensive list of frankish castles in Greece dating from 1377.

It perks atop an imposing cliff overlooking the coast and the village of **Thermisia**.

Close inspection of the rock reveals an even more daunting prospect than a first glance might suggest. Big, red, bulging and holdless seems to sum it up.

This is actually a great place to visit with a super view over the coast, a ruined castle to explore and a real classic line, **New Order**, which takes you up an unfeasibly overhanging wall at only 6a+.

The cliff is floodlit during the summer months and this would give a superb photo opportunity!

The highlight of a visit to the Caves of Fragthi is, without a doubt, the climbing experience in the third cavern.

you left the crag behind, but keep going up towards the windmills. At the col take a left u-turn towards the crag.

Move up a bit more through the windmills and you will eventually be able to park just below, with the crag below, to your left. Walk down the ridge to the crag.








#### **General information**

Rock of Ages, is a nice little cliff in an idyllic setting and highly recommended for those who are not only interested in pushing up their grades but also in their surroundings. A small ravine with lush vegetation, good rock and varied climbing offer a very pleasant day out.

**Rock of Ages** was mainly developed and bolted by the legendary climber and route setter **Jim Titt** and **I. Zaczek**. All routes are rather demanding and almost on all routes come with runouts.

Thus, the **Rock of Ages** is mainly for experienced climbers that feel comfortable with onsighting **6a+/6b**.

The highlights of **Rock of Ages** include the spectacular and photogenic overhanging **Mr Cool at 5c+** and the weird **Pull of the Sun at 6b**, which climbs up inside the cleft splitting the cliff face.

Plenty of potential on this undeveloped rock make it well worth a visit.




Approaching from **Ermioni**, turn right on the saddle before **Didyma** (Sign: Iliokastro). After 4,4 km, shortly before reaching a small church on the right side, turn left. Continue on this tarmac road for 2,8 km. Then go right on a small tarmac road for 1,9 km (the last 100 m. are on gravel). Turn left on concrete terrain and follow the road downwards.

Keep driving for another 800 m. towards a wide rock formation. Just before you reach it turn right and follow the road as it coils up to the saddle.

Turn left and follow this road for **about 750 m.** until you see the small ravine on the left. Park a few meters after the valley.



# **DIDYMA**

#### General information

Oros Didimon, or "**Didyma**", is a major crag of Argolis. Excellent access, superb rock, good orientation and magnificent views add up to one of the best sport climbing venues in Greece.

Climbs for every level of ability and perfect access to the top for setting up top ropes. There is also a more technical climbing area, on steep gray walls.

Crag development so far has focused on the first 250 m. of the cliff (sector "summertime"),

producing around **70 routes in the 4th, 5th, 6th** and **7th grades** with potential for several more in the higher grades.

A good family cliff with some beginner routes with some extra bolts on specific routes.

**Didyma crag** is certainly one of the best crags in the Ermionida region.
